- 1) The meeting was called to order by Mayor Daryl Behrends.
- 2) Members and Guests Present: Mayor; Daryl Behrends, Council members; Alan VanDam, Robert Prins and LeRoy Buys; Clerk, Kris Gunnink; City Maintenance/Waste Water Supervisor, Jeff Gunnink. Faye Schuur was absent with prior notice.
- 3) Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.
- 4) Bob Prins opened the meeting with prayer.
- 5) Bob Prins moved to approve the Minutes of the September 11, 2017 City Council Meeting. Seconded by Alan VanDam. Motion carried.

§90.02 Dogs

Running at large prohibited. It shall be unlawful for the dog of any person who owns, harbors or keeps a dog, to run at large. A person who owns, harbors or keeps a dog which runs at large shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. Dogs must be on a leash and accompanied by a responsible person.
